HISTORY

The Oregon Republican Party is headquartered in Salem, Oregon and is a state affiliate of the national Republican Party. The very first convention of Oregon was held in May 1856 at the Lindley schoolhouse in Jackson County. The purpose of the gathering was to nominate candidates who would appear on the June 1856 territorial ballot. The convention also adopted a resolution declaring that, while Congress and no authority over the existence of slavery in states where it was already established, all other US States and territories should follow the federal mandate and prevent its introduction within their own jurisdictions.

During the following February, another convention was held. The first Oregon Republican Party (ORP) "Platform Convention" was held on February 11, 1857 and was attended by 24 delegates from 8 counties. The purpose of the convention was to analyze, discuss, and come to a consensus on the overarching positions of the ORP. The final positional document was called "the platform." Every two years thereafter Oregon counties have been sending their ORP leaders to the Platform Convention.

At the 2023 Platform Convention, you are representing over 700,000 Oregon Republicans and taking part in the same traditions of our Oregon forefathers and mothers discussing, clarifying, and refining important issues of the day.

The resulting platform, as it was to our forebears, is a general representation of the views of the members of the Oregon Republican Party. Our members and elected officials are tasked with using these values to represent their constituents and to support or fight public policy and laws.

PLATFORM DEFINITIONS

The term "Section" refers to the preamble and the major sections of the Platform (i.e. Economy, Education, etc.) "Plank" refers to the single lines of each section. (1.1, 1.2, etc.)

All of the Sections and Planks combine to become the "Platform."

PLATFORM CONVENTION

Every two years, each county's Republican leadership in the Oregon Republican Party (ORP) gathers at a convention in odd numbered years. The purpose of this convention is to re-analyze, discuss and update the overarching positions of the organization to be called "the platform."

You are at this convention to represent the over 700,000 Oregon Republicans to provide tangible changes to the party's platform for 2023-2024. Key areas of political and social interest like the economy, education, family values are called "sections." The Oregon Republican Party's Platform has 17 sections to it. The specific positions within the section is called "a plank." This collective document will be used to describe what generally represents the views of Oregon's Republican members. You represent the registered Republican voters in your precinct. You are their representative just as your elected officials serving on many boards; city, state, and national, are for you. Do your best to not only consider your view, but the many you represent.

When done with others in mind, this "platform" enables our elected officials to better represent their constituents, creating public policy and laws using these values
