ORP NATIONAL DELEGATE SELECTION CONVENTION

On Saturday, May 25, 2024, the Oregon Republican Party will gather in Salem to elect Delegates to the Republican National Convention that meets July 15-19 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. All Oregonians registered as members of the Republican Party before November 23, 2023, are eligible to run for the position of Delegate or Alternate Delegate. To qualify to run for a Delegate or Alternate Delegate position, you must submit an application, along with a \$50 application fee, by 5pm on April 10, 2024. Symposium - May 24

In a rare opportunity, ORP has pulled together a host of exceptional speakers for an Election Integrity Symposium to be held from 1-5:30 pm. at the Keizer Event Center on May 24, the day before our Delegate Selection Convention. Joining us will be Rank Choice Voting expert Phillip Izon from Alaska and Cyber Security Expert Mark Cook, who will present a security evaluation of Oregon Election systems. County researchers from around the state will discuss their discoveries, and we will share important findings about the Oregon Centralized Voting System (OCVS) database. In addition, our Voter Registration researchers will discuss their findings.

Hundreds of grassroots Oregonians feel disenfranchised and have asked how they can help. Action is important. At this symposium you will learn what you can do, both in your counties and in the Legislature. Symposium registration fee will be \$60, and parking is free. More information will be available soon on our website.

Don't believe the rhetoric that your vote won't count, or that cheating means your vote won't make a difference. Don't believe the early polls that make it seem like your vote doesn't matter. Candidate Assistance Workshop - May 24

Now that the Primary filing deadline has passed, it's time to consider positions on the next ballot. For most city council and mayoral races, filing begins June 5th for the November ballot. Shortly after the November election, Special District elections will be held. These crucial positions include parks and recreation, school districts, fire, water, and more. Let's fill as many of these seats as possible with solid Republicans.

To help candidates prepare for these races, we are excited to announce a candidate development workshop on May 24th from 1-5:30 pm at the Keizer Event Center before the ORP Delegate Selection Convention. This workshop is tailored to individuals considering a first-time run for office to prepare them for city council or special district races. However, it is also open to those considering a future run or those who want to support candidate campaigns.

The workshop will cover a range of essential topics—messaging, ORESTAR, fundraising strategies, candidate selfassessment, creating a candidate committee, resumé enhancement for future roles, and other topics designed to help you win your race. Whether vou're considering a candidacy or eager to assist aspiring candidates, this workshop will equip you with necessary tools and insights. File to Become an Elected Precinct Committeeperson

Although the filing deadline has passed, did you know that qualified Republicans can still file to become an elected Precinct Committeeperson (PCP) by write-in on the May ballot?

PCPs are the grassroots workhorses of the Republican Party. They are passionate, committed volunteers who ensure that Republicans in their precincts are informed, prepared, and encouraged to vote. They cultivate relationships in their neighborhoods, educate voters, make phone calls, distribute materials, and walk precincts with candidates.

Oregon law requires that in order to be elected by write-in vote, qualified PCP candidates must declare their candidacy by submitting Form SEL105D before 8 p.m. on May 21, 2024, Primary Election Day. Write-in candidates can also be nominated by another person submitting SEL105N before the polls close on Primary Election Day. The forms can be taken in to your county elections office or submitted online. Contact your county party to help you determine which precinct(s) have unfilled seats.

The more PCPs we have working at the county level, the more effective will be our efforts to get information about our Republican candidates to voters, and to ensure that Republicans return their ballots. What is a Delegate? What is an Elector?

With news of the upcoming ORP Delegate Selection Convention, you may wonder "What exactly is a Delegate and an Alternate Delegate? What is an Elector? How do they differ?"

Delegates are Oregon's representatives to the Republican National Convention, which is convened for the purpose of nominating a Republican candidate for President and Vice President. Oregon Republican Delegates are bound to vote for the candidates selected by Oregon's Republican Primary voters for the first two rounds of voting at the Convention.

Fifty-nine (59) Oregon Republicans make up Oregon's Delegation to the Republican National Convention:

3 ORP officers—Chairman, National Committeewoman, & National Committeeman

10 At-Large Delegates

10 Alternate At-Large Delegates

18 Congressional District Delegates, three from each of Oregon's six U.S. Congressional Districts

18 Congressional District Alternate Delegates, three from each of Oregon's six U.S. Congressional Districts

All Delegates and Alternate Delegates are elected through a vote of current Republican Precinct Committeepersons who were elected in the Primary Election of 2022. To qualify to run for a Delegate or Alternate Delegate position, you must have been registered as a Republican for 180 days prior to the May 21, 2024 Primary Election. What about Electors? Who are they and what do they do?

Each Oregon political party elects a slate of eight (8) Electors to the Electoral College. If a party's candidate wins Oregon's November 2024 General Election for U.S. President, that party will send their eight Electors to the Electoral College to cast their votes for their party's candidate for President and Vice President of the United States. If a party's candidate does not win Oregon's popular vote for U. S. President, that party's Electors will not be seated and will not have a vote in the Electoral College.
